Festival Alur Bunyi Marks the Start of Goethe-Institut Indonesien's 60-Year Anniversary Celebrations

Goethe-Institut Indonesien will present numerous music performances featuring a variety of genres at Festival Alur Bunyi, which takes place free of charge on Saturday, 10th September 2022, from 2 p.m. to 11 p.m. WIB at the Goethe-Institut Jakarta. This festival marks the opening of a series of celebrations for Goethe-Institut Indonesien's 60th anniversary.

Alur Bunyi is a concert series program initiated by Goethe-Institut Indonesien that has consistently highlighted experimental electronic music since 2017. "This year, Alur Bunyi will be presented in the form of a one-day festival for the first time, highlighting music from well-known Indonesian musicians from across different genres. The diversity of musical genres in this festival represents the wide variety of cultural activities that Goethe-Institut Indonesien has presented since 1962 in Indonesia," says Dr Ingo Schöningh, Director of Cultural Programs at Goethe-Institut Indonesien.

The festival, which was curated by jazz composer Adra Karim, will feature various music genres ranging from classical, electronic, folk, jazz, and swing, to punk rock. As an opening act, Klassikhaus will present a collaboration between Windy Setiadi (bandoneon) and Budi Utomo Prabowo (harpsichord, piano) as well as guest stars Muhammad Ravi Arrauf (contrabassist) and Siko Setyanto (dancer), presenting works by composers from the baroque, postromantic, and modern eras.

The music performances will take place in two locations at the Goethe-Institut Jakarta, namely at the GoetheHaus and the library, with the schedule below:
