3 As a class, pick the most interesting questions for the survey and create a questionnaire that you will send to other students.



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4 You received a survey from the partner class. Answer the questions individually.



5 Evaluate the results of your survey. Read the responses from the students in the partner class. In a group, discuss the similarities and differences of your shopping habits and take notes. What are the areas, about which you want to know more? Write down your questions.

6 As a whole class, collect and organize the results of group work as well as **ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS** before you meet with the other class online.
