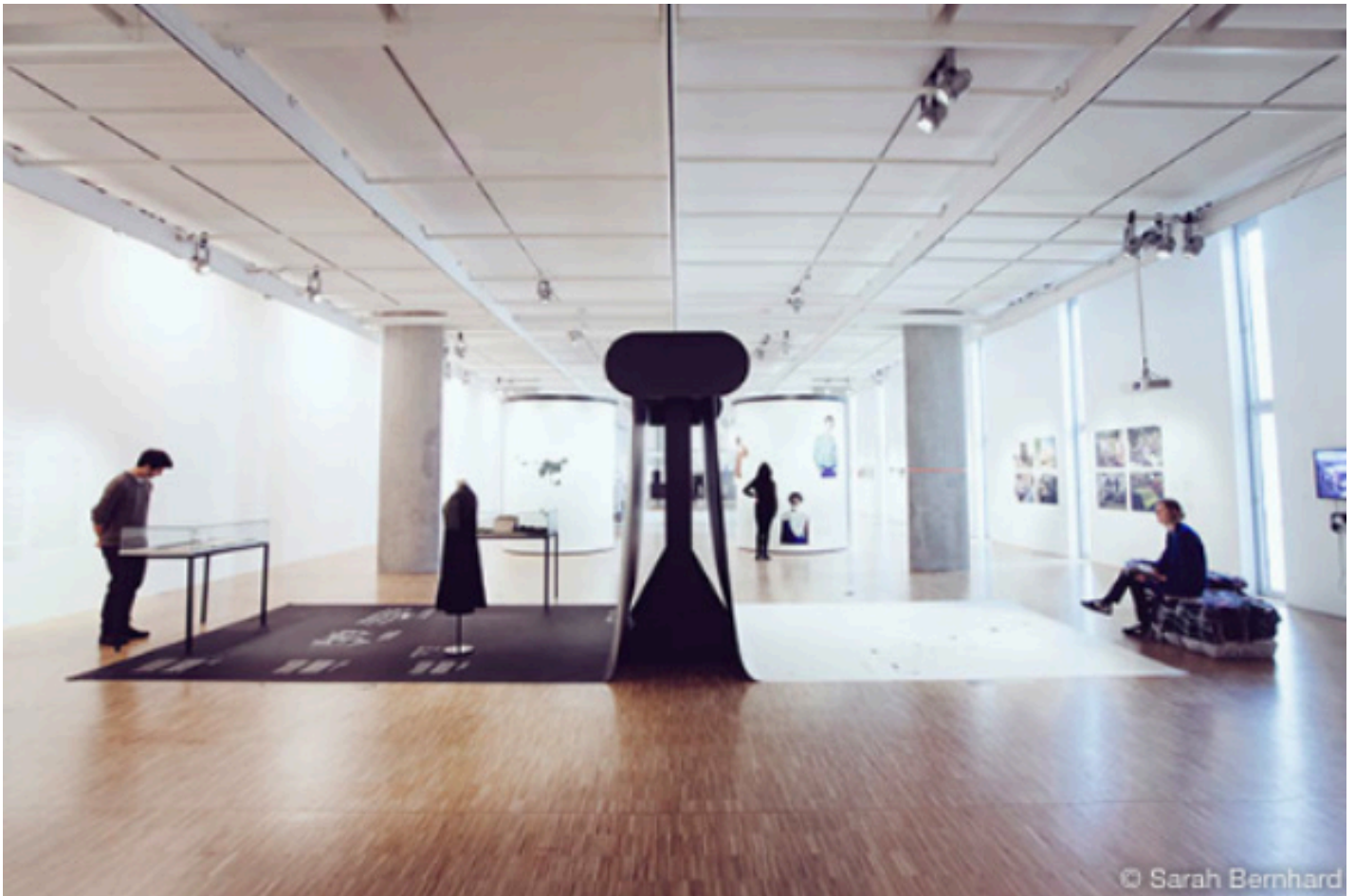


Learn about ‘the dark side of fashion’ at UP Diliman exhibit

Goethe-Institut Philippinen has partnered with the University of the Philippines College of Home Economics to look into the cost of today’s fashion in an exhibit called “The Dark Side of Fashion,” which highlights the ignored realities behind the booming clothing industry.

The exhibit offers digital installations and interactive displays with information about the harmful practices of big retail brands like damaging the environment with garbage *a.k.a.* last season’s trends.
