Theme 1 - Session 2 (of 2)

Tips and Tricks for your Club Session

- Go over pronunciation help
- Have all your material laid out and ready to use
- Think of engaging gestures, routines and rituals to build a sense of togetherness and to aid repetition of vocabulary
- Keep it positive - model correct use of language, instead of correcting mistakes
- Have fun and incorporate play and movement as much as possible
- Go on a language discovery journey with the pupils - display curiosity

Objective:

To be able to ask someone how they are feeling, to say how you feel, to say thank you and goodbye informally and formally. To become familiar with German pronunciation.

Materials

- Access to the GImagine Award platform (instructions on how to use the platform and find the materials can be found on a separate instruction sheet)
- A digital tablet or computer for each child, alternatively one for two children
- Map of Europe
- Map of Germany (available from the Goethe-Institut)
- Interactive whiteboard/screen
- A ball or a small object (pen, ruler)



Time	Social Form	Learning Objective	Content	Materials	Phrases and Gestures
5 min	Whole group	The pupils learn how to ask someone how they are doing and how to express their mood. They get familiar with the phrasing of simple questions, the informal interjection "Na". They learn basic vocabulary related to feelings by reading it, hearing it and repeating it together.	<p>Play the video once and ask someone to rephrase the meaning and use of the Word "Na".</p> <p>Let the pupils repeat the question "Na, wie geht es dir?" all together.</p> <p>Go through the three possible answers given in the second stage:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mir geht es gut, danke! Und dir? – I'm fine, thank you! And you? • Nicht so gut, leider. – Not so good, unfortunately. • Es geht, danke! – I'm okay, thanks. <p>Let the pupils read the answers one after the other and repeat them all together.</p> <p>At the end, play the audio and listen all together to the answers again trying to memorize them.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • German starter course on the GImagine Award platform: The three stages "Na, wie geht es dir?", "Es geht, danke!" and "Kurze Dialoge" of step 3 in the first module "Na, wie geht's dir? Say hello and good-bye" • Interactive whiteboard/screen 	<p>Wir schauen uns das Video an. – Let's watch the video.</p> <p>Wie geht es dir? – How are you?</p> <p>Was antwortest du auf diese Frage? – How do you respond to this question?</p>
5 min	In pairs	The pupils feel comfortable to use the new vocabulary in a dialogue.	<p>In pairs, the pupils practise the newly acquired vocabulary by asking each other how they are and responding to the question, if possible, at the end without looking at their notes.</p> <p>If the pupils are struggling, you can show the dialogue on screen.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • German starter course on the GImagine Award platform: The third stage "Kurze Dialoge" of step 3 in the first module "Na, wie geht's dir? Say hello and good-bye" • Interactive whiteboard/screen 	Partnerarbeit mit dem Dialog – Work with a partner on the dialogue.

5 min	Whole group	The pupils learn how to thank someone and can react to someone thanking them.	<p>Play the video at least twice and make sure the pupils understand the nuances between the four ways to say "thank you".</p> <p>Ask the pupils to repeat:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1000 (Tausend) Dank! – A thousand thanks! • Danke! Das ist echt lieb von dir! – Thanks, that's really kind of you! • Danke, du bist meine Rettung. – Thank you, you're my savior. • Danke! Das weiß ich sehr zu schätzen. – Thank you! I really appreciate it. <p>At the end, play the audio of the third stage "Dialoge mit "danke"", listen again, and try to memorize them.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • German starter course on the GImagine Award platform: The first stage "Danke sagen" and third stage "Dialoge mit "danke"" of step 4 in the first module "Na, wie geht's dir? Say hello and good-bye" • Interactive whiteboard/screen 	<p>Wir schauen uns das Video an. – Let's watch the video.</p> <p>Wie sagt man "thanks" auf Deutsch? – How to say "thanks" in German?</p> <p>Wir hören die Dialoge an. – Let's listen to the dialogues.</p>

		The pupils are aware of regional variants.	<p>Explain to the pupils other ways to say goodbye:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Auf Wiedersehen! – Goodbye! (formally) • Tschüss! – Goodbye! (informally) • Bis bald! – See you soon! • Mach ´s gut! – take care! <p>At the end, play the audio in the third stage "Abschiedsdialoge", listen again, and try to memorize them.</p>	<p>stages "Das sage ich zum Abschied", "Varianten zum Abschied" and "Abschiedsdialoge" of step 5 in the first module "Na, wie geht's dir? 10 min	In pairs in front of the whole group	The pupils try to brainstorm everything they have learnt in theme 1 and perform a dialogue in front of the class.	<p>Give the pupils 5 minutes to work in pairs. The aim is to review the vocabulary acquired in theme 1. To do this, the pupils go over the greetings in pairs, asking each other how they are, where they come from and where they live, and then saying goodbye to each other.</p> <p>If this exercise is too difficult, the pupils can be given time to prepare it</p>		<p>Wie wiederholen die neuen Vokabeln. – Let's repeat the new vocabulary.</p> <p>Wir erfinden einen kurzen Dialog. – Let's invent a short dialogue.</p>

5 min	Whole group	The pupils get familiar with the German phonetic, pronouncing some German brands out loud.	<p>Play the short video. Ask the pupils to pay attention to the differences in pronunciation and repeat the correct pronunciation of BMW und Aldi.</p> <p>Play a game. Ask the pupils to name other German brands and try to pronounce them correctly. To make sure you do, type them into Google translate and use the German voiceover.</p> <p>If the pupils don't come up with German brands, you can play with the following ones, which pupils might be familiar with:</p> <p>Haribo Ritter Sport Katjes (vegan candies) Trolli Knoppers Lidl Volkswagen (VW) Audi Mercedes-Benz Adidas</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> German starter course on the GImagine Award platform: The second stage "Phonetik: Deutsche Marken" of step "Spotlight" in the first module "Na, wie geht's dir?
