3 min	Whole group	Students can name and describe an object in a classroom	The teacher starts the lesson with a short review of the previous lesson by asking the children which object Wuschel found in last week's class (der Legostein). The teacher explains that they will look for another object today. (slide 2)	PPT slides 2-4	Hallo Kinder - Hello children (Children could answer: Hallo, 'name of club leader') Seid ihr bereit? - Are you ready? (Children could answer: Ja!)
			The teacher asks the children to look at slide 3 and guess where Miki and Wuschel are (in der Schule). The teacher asks the children if they can find another one of Wuschel's objects in the picture (slide 4) . (der Bleistift)		Welches Objekt haben wir letzte Woche gefunden? - Which object did we find last week?

					Wo sind Miki und Wuschel? - Where are Miki and Wuschel? in der Schule – at school
7 min	Whole group	Students can identify objects in a classroom	Now the teacher asks the students to come to the front and form a half circle around the board (slide 5). The teacher reads the first sentence and asks a student to match it to an object in the picture by drawing a line. The activity continues until all sentences have been matched up with the corresponding objects. On the next slide the children match objects and words (slide 6). The class then practises the pronunciation for the objects (slide 7). The teacher reads and points at the objects, while the children repeat after the teacher. 5 min	Small groups	Students can name objects in a classroom and identify their colour(s)	The teacher explains that they will play a game called "Find the object" (slide 8). The teacher assigns the children to small teams and each team receives image cards. The teacher reads the descriptions on slide 9 and the teams have to find the matching objects. The teacher can uncover the object by removing the grey box.	PPT slides 8-9 Image cards	Was ist das? - What is this? 7 min	In pairs/ Whole group	Students understand the numbers in German	The teacher asks the children to open their books to pages 28-29 and asks them to work on task one in pairs. Once the children have finished, the teacher can ask the pairs for the solutions and write the correct numbers on the board (slide 10). The teacher then writes down the numbers in German next to the boxes. This way the teacher introduces the numbers in German. Using slide 11 the teacher subsequently introduces the remaining numbers. Note It's important here to practise the pronunciation of the words by reading the numbers out loud and asking the children to repeat. The teacher also encourages the students to work on tasks 2-5 in the book at home and also listen to the dialogue of this chapter. 7 min	In pairs	Students can recall the numbers in German	The teacher explains that the children will play another game and test the new vocabulary. The teacher splits the children into teams of 2 and instructs them to play the numbers game.
